# Donna Weng Friedman

Award-winning pianist Donna Weng Friedman enjoys a distinguished career as a soloist, chamber musician, educator, curator, producer, and filmmaker. Donna was selected as one of Musical America's Top 30 Professionals of 2024 for her outstanding contribution to the performing arts. In the special January issue featuring these top professionals, Musical America will announce her latest initiative: Heritage and Harmony: BRAVA Maestra! This project, in partnership with the International Alliance for Women in Music aims to spotlight women conductors from our AAPI and BIPOC communities, further demonstrating Donna's commitment to promoting diversity and inclusivity in the classical music world. https://www.donnawengfriedman.com/

# Steven Bianchi

Steven Bianchi is the Director of the Amherst School of Music, where he also teaches piano and oversees its programs. A respected figure in Western New York's music education scene, his students have won regional, national, and international prizes and earned university scholarships. A dedicated teacher since 1975, Bianchi studied with Harold Bradley—himself a student of piano legends Isidor Philipp and Mark Hambourg—absorbing European traditions of piano pedagogy. He earned both his B.A. and M.A. in music from the University at Buffalo and has served as a judge for competitions such as the Claudette Sorel Piano Competition and the International Prominent Pianists Festival. As a composer, his works have been performed at Buffalo State College and Chautauqua Institution. With over 100,000 piano lessons taught, he now lectures on community-level piano teaching and is writing a book on piano pedagogy to guide new teachers in the field.



The Amherst School of Music, Inc. is a community based not-for-profit corporation founded in 1987. It provides musical instruction to primarily school age children in the metropolitan Buffalo area. Adult instruction is also provided by a few of the instructors. The teachers teach in a "traditional" style. This means the curriculum is developed around the strengths, interest and talent of the student. The faculty at the ASM is mostly comprised of professional teachers whose primary vocation is music education. Many are graduates of music conservatories from various countries.

# Steve Robinson

Steve Robinson is an American radio manager, producer and executive producer. He has held senior management positions with numerous American radio stations, including WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network/Chicago, WBUR/Boston, WGBH/Boston, WCRB/Boston, KPFA/Berkeley, WBGO/Newark, Vermont Public Radio and Nebraska Public Radio Network. Robinson served as general manager of the statewide Nebraska Public Radio Network (1990-2000) and WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network from 2000 until October 2016. A 50-year radio veteran, he has produced programs ranging from classical music documentaries to public affairs programs and has directed over 100 on-air pledge drives.

In 1984, he co-founded AIR, the Association of Independents in Radio, a service organization to assist independent radio producers in the United States. Robinson wrote AIR's first two successful grants from the New York State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts. Throughout his career, Robinson has produced dozens of radio programs that have been heard throughout the world, including live broadcasts from Salzburg, Austria (on the occasion of Mozart's 250th birthday); Durbin, South Africa (for the world premiere for the opera, "Princess Magogo"); Quebec City, Canada (for a live broadcast of Mahler's Symphony of a Thousand with 1000 performers); Jerusalem, Israel (for a broadcast from the Jerusalem International Chamber Music Festival); and has produced numerous live broadcasts from Chicago and throughout the U.S. He has worked with William Schuman, Elliott Carter, Charles Dodge, Roger Reynolds, Alan Hovhaness and other composers on programs about their music. In 2003, he created the daily classical music appreciation radio program, Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin. The series is carried by state networks throughout the world including Australia and China. At the WFMT Radio Network he created the first classical music radio exchange between the United States and China.

In 2000, Robinson became the general manager of WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network. Founded in 1951, WFMT is considered as one of the most admired classical music stations in the U.S. and under his leadership many new programs were added to the local schedule, including Introductions, Impromptu and others. Robinson worked on diversifying the programs of WFMT by expanding the amount of live broadcasting from the station.

One of his most important initiatives at the WFMT Radio Network was the creation of Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin, in 2003. This daily, one-hour music appreciation program is heard on over 60 U.S. stations and has a weekly audience of over 400,000 unique listeners. The program is also heard in Australia, Guam, the Philippines and in Beijing. Initial funding for Exploring Music was provided by the National Endowment for the Arts with additional funding from individuals and foundations.

The station under his leadership focused on live music by broadcasting a wide array of local Chicago groups and ensembles. In 2007, the Chicago Tribune named him "Chicagoan of the Year" in the arts.

In 2015, he executed a cross-cultural broadcast relationship between America and China by exporting to China for the first time broadcasting concerts by the NY Philharmonic, LA Philharmonic, San Francisco Symphony, Dallas Symphony, Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall. He also arranged for concerts from the Shanghai Spring International Music Festival and the Shanghai Symphony Orchestra to be exported to the West with broadcasts in the U.S., Canada and Europe.

In 2004 and again in 2010, Robinson created and produced two, live, 17-hour fundraising campaigns involving all Chicago radio and TV stations to aid victims of the tsunami in the southeast and the earthquake in Haiti. Each campaign raised over \$3 million. Robinson received two Wesbury Award from the American Red Cross of Greater Chicago for the fundraising campaigns. In 2008, Robinson and Bill McGlaughlin received the Dushkin Award for Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin from the Music Institute of Chicago. He has received local and national awards for his work in Chicago, including the Champion Award from the Merit School of Music, the ASCAP/Deems Taylor Award for creative programming and others.

## <u>David Wroe</u> Maestro

Maestro Wroe is Music Director of the New Jersey Festival Orchestra, Principal Conductor at Phoenicia International Festival of the Voice in New York, and a frequent conductor of L'Orchestre Régional de Normandie in France. From 2000-2014 he was a regular conductor with New York City Opera, leading and assisting in numerous productions. Orchestras conducted include the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Saint Louis Symphony, Royal Scottish National Orchestra, L'Orchestre National de Lille, Opera de Toulon, New Jersey Symphony L'Ensemble de Paris, Symphony Nova Scotia, Kansas City Symphony, Santa Fe Symphony, New York City Ballet, Neue Brandenberg Symphony, L'Orchestra Lamoureux with cellist Mstislav Rostropovich, Opera de Toulon, Jerusalem Symphony Orchestra, Das Loh-Orchester Sondershausen, Philharmonische Orchester der Stadt Heidelberg, Delaware, Harrisburg, Huntsville, De Moines Symphony, and numerous tours of Western Austria with Vorarlberg Symphony and at the Bregenz Frühlings Festival. Maestro Wroe is a preferred conductor in Asia, having directed the Taiwan National Symphony, Pusan Philharmonic, Shenzhen, Macau, Hangzhou, Nanjing, Wuhan, Zhejiang, Guiyang, and The Taipei and Taichung Symphony Orchestras. He was Music Director of Music on the Mountain: Garrett Lakes Arts Summer Festival in Maryland from 2000 – 2006, and Music Director and Founder of the Kansas City Camerata from 1990-1996.

Maestro Wroe was Seiji Ozawa's Assistant Conductor at the Boston Symphony Orchestra, leading the Orchestra in Tanglewood (with Joshua Bell) in Boston's Symphony Hall (with Horacio Gutierrez), collaborating with Jessye Norman's recording of "Phaedra", and Itzhak Perlman's recording of Bernstein's Serenade, and touring Europe with the Boston Symphony Orchestra Chamber Players. 2007 marked Maestro Wroe's recording debut with L'Orchestre National de Lille on the TransArt label with pianist Bruno Fontaine, and numerous broadcast recordings, through Austrian Broadcasting Authority (ORF), with the Vorarlberg Symphony.

In addition to his residency at New York City Opera, Maestro Wroe was Resident Conductor at Oper der Stadt Heidelberg (1998-2002), Principal Conductor at Opera Delaware (2000 – 2005), and directed the summer 'Opera Under the Stars' series at the 7000 seater Garden State Arts Center in NJ. From 2005-10 he was Music Director of Opera Teatro Grattacielo in NY, opened for the newly formed Fresno International Grand Opera, and served as Judge with Anna Moffo for the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions.

Maestro Wroe, through the NJ Festival Orchestra, has diverse experience in cross-over genres, having collaborated with Kristin Chenoweth, Mannheim Steamrollers, Celtic Women, The 3 Irish Tenors, Natalie Merchant, Joan Rivers, Don Rickles, Bob Newhart, Jackie Evancho and Celtic Thunder, and a return guest at Ocean City Pops Orchestra, to name but a few.

Maestro Wroe devotes considerable time to aspiring musicians. In 2014 he held a residency at Brown University Symphony Orchestra (Rhode Island) as its Interim Music Director, was Principal Conductor at N.Y. University Symphony Orchestra (2008-2011), and Director of Orchestras at Montclair State University, NJ (2000-2005). He led the Boston Symphony Orchestra Youth Concerts, the Taipei Symphony Orchestra Summer Youth Festival, given master-classes at New England Conservatory, Harvard University, Rutgers University and University of Alabama. He has served as Judge for the Music Assistance Fund administered by the League of American Orchestras, and was the Chairman of the Jury of the New Jersey MTA State Concerto Competition.

Awards are numerous, including the Seiji Ozawa Fellowship at Tanglewood, a citation in United States Congress for community commitment, and finalist in the 1st Bernstein International Conducting Competition. He attended Lancing College, has a BMus from Manchester University (England), a MM from Northwestern (Chicago), and studied with Gustav Meier and Victor Yampolsky.

# The Musicians



Edmund Dawe
Pianist

Canada's classical music magazine, La Scena Musicale, has described Edmund Dawe's playing as "sensitive, engaging, and virtuoso". He has garnered international praise for his technical command of the piano and compelling interpretations. Edmund has performed as a soloist and collaborative pianist in North America, Europe, Asia, and the Middle East. He has been twice nominated for an East Coast Music Award (Best Classical) for his solo recording, Sonatas, and piano duo recording, Dialogue, with colleague Lynn Johnson. Edmund's recordings and other performances have been featured in numerous broadcasts in Canada as well as Chicago's WFMT and New York's WQXR. In addition, his artistry has been recognized by numerous grants and awards from the Canada Council for the Arts, the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade, Provincial Arts Councils, and the Foundation to Assist Canadian Talent on Records (F.A.C.T.O.R.).

A respected teacher and administrator, Edmund has held appointments at several leading Canadian universities, and received prestigious awards for his performing, teaching and university service. Most recently, he served as Dean of the Desautels Faculty of Music at the University of Manitoba. Edmund led the Desautels Faculty of Music through a period of innovative program development, enrolment and endowment growth, and construction of the most modern university music facilities in Canada. Upon his retirement from the University of Manitoba, Edmund was appointed Dean Emeritus. In 2021, he launched a podcast, For Piano Teachers, that now has listeners and subscribers in 107 countries.

Recognized for his distinguished career, Edmund is listed in the Canadian Who's Who Directory. Documenting the accomplishments of Canadians from a wide variety of professions, the publication highlights the national diversity of culture and provides detailed information on the accomplishments of notable Canadians from coast to coast. Edmund is represented by Jack Price at Price Attractions Artist Management.



Cristina Maria Noli
Composer

Cristina Maria Noli (Cuggiono (MI), 1986) began her musical studies on the flute during her classical high school education. In 2009, still not yet graduated, she was chosen for the first national performance of the piece by the German composer Barbara Heller "La Palmera" as part of the "In-audita musica" event at the "F.lli Olivieri" auditorium of the Novara Conservatory. She studied composition with Maestro Maurizio Ferrari at the "Peri-Merulo" Higher Institute of Musical Studies in Reggio Emilia, where she participated, as a performer, in important national events such as "L'ora della musica" and "Compositori a confronto" (2011). She was also called upon to take part in the production of the shows "Il futuro spezzato" (2012, Masini auditorium in Reggio Emilia) and, in the same year, in the show "Lucifero", staged at the Teatro dei Rinnovati in Siena. She later studied with Maestro Giorgio Planesio at the "G. F. Ghedini" Conservatory in Cuneo. There she was selected among the students of the composition classes to take part in the writing of the musical part of the show "Orfeo" (2015), staged at the "Toselli" Theater and the "San Giovanni" Hall in Cuneo; at the same time, her solo harp piece "Pàs à pàs" was mentioned and included in the artistic season of the Cuneo Conservatory for the event "Compongo l'arpa", in collaboration with the Salvi company.

Cristina has won several prizes in national and international competitions (including the First Prize in the 3rd Instrumental Competition "Don Giovanni Conta" in Spineto di Castellamonte (To) and the First Prize in the 6th International Young Musicians Competition "Antonio Salieri" in Legnago (VR)). After moving to Milan, she was admitted to the class of Maestro Giuseppe Colardo and later to that of Maestro Sonia Bo, under whose guidance she graduated brilliantly in October 2022. Last year, several of her works were performed for the first time, including: "Trinus" for flute and clarinet at the "Puccini" Hall of the Milan Conservatory; "Suggestioni" for wind quartet at the Pinacoteca Civica in Ascoli Piceno and at the Pesaro Conservatory (finalist of the "Mauro Crocetta" Competition of the same year); "Omaggio" for voice and guitar at the Pinacoteca Civica in Como; "Sogni che tramutano i pensieri" for flute, clarinet, and piano at the Museo del Novecento in Milan.



JinUk Lee Baritone

Dr. JinUk Lee has an extensive and distinguished career as a baritone soloist, performing oratorio solos both in Korea and the USA. His notable performances include the baritone solos in Handel's Messiah and Haydn's The Creation. Dr. Lee received his early training under Professor InSoo Park in South Korea and continued his studies with renowned professors Andreas Poulimenos and Carol Vaness at Indiana University.

During his time at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, Dr. Lee portrayed Germont in La Traviata under the baton of David Effron and the direction of Tito Capobianco. He also brought to life the characters of Zurga in The Pearl Fishers, Silvio in Pagliacci, and the Count in Le nozze di Figaro while studying with Professor Carol Vaness. His versatility extended to roles such as Papageno in Die Zauberflöte and Tiger Brown in The Threepenny Opera, earning him honors at showcase recitals and the Outstanding Performance Award in the Honors Assembly in Ohio.

Dr. Lee has earned numerous accolades, including first prize for vocal music at the National Artistic Vocal Competition and second prize at the Indianapolis Matinee Musicale competition. He is a recipient of the Sweet Adelines International Award from the Young Singers Foundation and the Albert Rees Davis Scholarship from the S. Livingston Mather Scholarship Competition in Cleveland. Furthermore, he won first place in the National Association of Teachers of Singing Competition and was a finalist in the Mario Lanza International Singing Competition in Italy. His academic and performance excellence was recognized with the Merit Award Scholarship, and he served as an opera assistant at the Lyric Theatre at the University of Illinois for three years, performing roles such as Ford in Falstaff, Street Singer in The Threepenny Opera, and Riolobo in Florencia en el Amazonas.

Currently, Dr. JinUk Lee is a professor and the director of the Master of Arts in Worship Korean Track at Northern Seminary in Chicago, IL. He also serves as the music director of four different choirs in the Chicagoland area. Dr. Lee holds degrees from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (DMA), Ohio University (MA), Indiana University at Bloomington (PD), and Kyungpook National University (BA). He began his teaching career as a music professor at Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana, and continues to be represented professionally by Vocal Artists Management as a baritone singer.

In addition to his academic and musical endeavors, Dr. Lee actively promotes his work through various media outlets. He has been featured in broadcasts and interviews on Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) in Seoul and Daejeon, MCTV-Chicago Win Media, and GOODTV in Korea. His future performance plans include collaborations with distinguished artists in both the United States and Korea, with engagements at the Chicago Korean Cultural Center and FEBC in Seoul and Daejeon. Dr. Lee's contributions to music and his dynamic presence in both academic and performance spheres highlight his exceptional talent and dedication to the performing arts.



Matthew Brand
Pianist/Composer

Matthew Brand is an 11th grader at Horace Mann School. Matthew began his piano studies with Donna Weng Friedman in 2013. He studies classical piano, composition, music theory, ear training, and jazz at Mannes Prep in the Scholar's Program. Matthew studies composition with Dr. Steven Sacco and plays in the jazz ensemble at Mannes under the direction of Martin Shapiro. Matthew also studies jazz and composition with Adam Dyer in London, England. He studies songwriting and vocal performance with Jason Pomerantz, and from April to July 2024, he wrote, produced, and recorded a self-titled 5 song EP of original Pop-Rock music at Smash Studios Midtown, receiving over 20,000 streams across all platforms. He has also participated in programs such as Interlochen Center For the Arts, the Litchfield Jazz Camp, the Manhattan School of Music's Jazz Composition and Performance program, and studies jazz guitar with Joe Ravo.

Throughout his high school career starting in 2022, Matthew won the Progressive Musicians Concerto Competition (2022) and performed the First Movement of the Haydn Concerto in D Major with his original jazz cadenza at Weill Carnegie Hall with the New York Chamber Players' Orchestra under Maestro Giacomo Franci. More recently in 2024, Matthew wrote a jazz-inspired concerto for piano and orchestra called "Fusion Fantasy" and was chosen as a Finalist at the Mannes Prep Concerto Competition. He also hosts an annual Charity Rock concert at Horace Mann called "UrbanAid" and plays rock and jazz gigs throughout New York, including the Mercury Lounge, Stephen Talkhouse, and the Delancey.



Dwight Stong
Composer

Dwight Stone is a composer, pianist, and conductor in the Bay Area of California. His compositions reflect his involvement in many facets of music: vocal, choral, brass, orchestra, guitar, and piano. Stone's harmonic language lies in the tonal realm evoking harmonies beyond the mainstream with a penchant for aesthetic dissonance and polychords.

He has won numerous prizes in the Music Teachers' Association of California (MTAC) Composition Competition as well as the United States Open Music Competition (USOMC) for original piano composition, for piano improvisation, and other awards for choral works.

An advocate of public performance, Dwight Stone founded St. Paul's Concert Series in Walnut Creek, and Trinity Concert Series in Pleasanton, both thriving venues.

The StoneMusique Catalog comprises over 60 pieces for piano, three dozen compositions for chorus, selections for brass, solo voice, orchestra, and chamber ensemble. Commissions include Whither Thou Goest (piano solo), An Irish Blessing (SSAA a cappella); Awake! Awake! (TTBB, 2 French horns, pianoforte) winning first prize in the Jewish Music Competition of Los Angeles; Psalm 100—Make a Joyful Noise! (SATB Choir, oboe, organ, timpani).

His setting of the transformative poem And On That Day (Rev. Will McGarvey, Interfaith Council of Contra Costa County) was composed for the World Peace Interfaith Celebration (2015). Love Is!, a gospel-pop composition for chorus and baritone solo (composed for Millennium Dream, Los Angeles) was performed at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Interfaith Celebration in Walnut Creek (2017).

Dwight Stone's original Amsterdam CD (flute and piano) with flutist Nika Rejto was featured at the Greater San Francisco International Flute Festival, and at the Festival of New American Music (FENAM) in Sacramento. He has performed concerts internationally (New Zealand; Croatia; Austria; France), and locally as solo artist, accompanist, popular music with "The Touchstones", and jazz with The CoolTones Big Band.

Dwight Stone resides in Walnut Creek, serving as Minister of Music and Worship at Trinity Lutheran Church, Pleasanton, where his compositions, arrangements and accompaniments continue to charm singers, congregations, and audiences alike.

Laura Ansaldi Soprano



In 2022 and 2023, she launched her "Soprano Solo" recital series for soprano and a solo string instrument.

She served as head of vocal studies and later president of the Terre dei Fieschi Academy in Italy. 

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
